Two Charged -- no injunction!

Eurocan Strikers Charged

Two CEP members of, Local 298 were charged after lending their support to Hazelton picketers from Carnaby Mill, August 9. The brothers were part of a group of striking workers from Eurocan in Kitimat who travelled to Hazelton in support of Local 404.

Jack McCamy and Kevin Read were charged with "interfering with a police officer and public mischief" during the stand-off at the mill..

New Skeena, owner of the Carnaby mill, had sent two flatbed trucks owned by Drake Towing www.draketowing.com from the lower mainland to the mill site to remove heavy equipment to pay back taxes.

The CEP brothers and aboriginal leaders, joined forces along with Carnaby workers, whose jobs are being sold off by New Skeena, at the two month old blockade to stop the dismantling of the mill.

The arrests were made following a peaceful

confrontation between 20 police officers and the blockaders, when the brothers refused to make way for the trucks to enter the site.

Police have said charges are pending for two other people, Yvonne Lattie, (Suu Dee) who chained herself between two trucks and her mother Mercy, an elder of the Gitksan people. They have yet to be laid.

CEP backs workers

Dave Coles, CEP Western Region Vice President said, "The CEP will back those who have been charged or are yet to be charged in this incident. We will ensure they are represented and supported."

No injunction

New Skeena has not applied to the courts for an injunction to allow it to attempt to move equipment again, inspite of the advice of Police.
