For the past 3 month, 298 members have been driving to Hazelton and doing 24 hour picket duty to shore up the blockade at the Carnaby Mill site.

Mo Azaz, President of Local 404 at Carnaby said, "Local 298 members have shown incredible solidarity. We could not have done as well holding off the company sale of equipment and dismantling of the mill without their support."

"We have been out of work for a long time and we know the hardship they have faced during their 3 month strike -- yet they were there every day for us. We want to express our deep gratitude to them and wish them well in their settlement "
